Re: Perdue Farms' dramatic success in reducing antibiotic use in chicken production

Dear Mr. Perdue:

On behalf of the Keep Antibiotics Working coalition, I write to congratulate you on Perdue Farms' success in dramatically reducing the quantity of antibiotics that are used in chicken production, as reported by *USA Today* on January 24. These reductions help decrease the development and spread of antibiotic-resistant bacteria both on food and via the environment, thus protecting human and animal health by extending the effectiveness of antibiotics in combating bacterial disease.

Specifically, *USA Today* reports that that Perdue has entirely eliminated the routine use of all feed grade antibiotics used to promote growth. In addition, the story states that "at any given farm in [Perdue's] system, only one flock in five years receives antibiotics, either to halt a disease outbreak or because birds are threatened with infection." These substantial reductions in antibiotic use are important not only in themselves, but also because they demonstrate that chicken can be produced without the extensive use of antibiotics.
